SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General notes

Take off all contaminated clothing immediately. In case of accident or if you feel unwell, seek medical advice immediately (show the label where possible).

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Following inhalation

Excessive exposure to spray mist, fog, or vapours may cause respiratory irritation. Coughing, sneezing, nasal discharge, labored breathing. May cause respiratory sensitization in susceptible individuals.

Contact with skin may cause irritation (redness, itching).

Following eye contact

Discomfort or pain, excessive blinking, lacrimation and redness, swelling of the conjunctiva. On contact with eyes causes serious damage.

Following ingestion

May cause nausea/vomiting and diarrhea. Attention, danger of foam aspiration.
